## Representative Matters

The case was argued to an arbitration panel which award damages in favor of the general contractor.

Served as arbitration advocates prosecuting the contractor's wrongful termination and change order claims against the owner and the owner's agent, and defending against the owner's "bad faith" counterclaim.

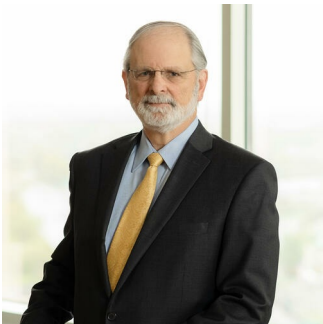
